Return to Our Roots

Now that the 1P career field consolidation has been in effect for several years and the "new" has worn off I thought I would take a few minutes to refresh all on some of the actual Army Air Corps/USAF background of our

career field. I have a lot of information, photos, and documentation from Mr. Don Bock and Oscar Norberg including several audio tapes that I have provided to Bob McElwain. Bob has placed the recordings on the Web for all to listen to. Oscar Norberg was an Instructor at Chanute in the Parachute Training Course in the early 50's.

Lester Williamson has told us at the reunions of his first duty as a parachute rigger when he first signed up in the late 40's and I also know that Jim Cartwright was a parachute rigger (Military Occupational Specialty, MOS 620) in his early career and specifically during the Berlin Airlift when he was stationed in England. I am sure that several of the other initial "Life Supporters" also came up Parachute Riggers. The first formal fact that I know is from Bill Baxter who graduated from Chanute in the spring of 1951 with a MOS of 594 which covered both Parachute Rigger and Personal Equipment. Bill told me "Five of us young airmen went to Carswell AFB TX and I was the only one who ended up in Personal Equipment on the B-36 with 15 crewmembers, talk about a warehouse of equipment".

I remember that while I was at Chanute during the mid-60's the Mobile Travel Teams (MTT's) traveled with a Life Support and Parachute Rigger as a team. I traveled with TSgt PEMBERMAN on several trips (Yokota, Osan, and MacDill) with the F-4 and I remember Clarence Benton and another Parachute Rigger made the USAF circle of ADC Bases teaching the F-106B seat. The MTT's always "fought to travel to Bergstrom or any 12AF Base" because Hank Counts made sure the trip was successful.

While I was at TAC Requirements Chief Roberson from LGMF traveled as the acquisition manager for SEAWARS, AFWARS and other programs.

Later it was Jim Cooper, Tom Phillips, and the Survival Equipment Troops at Tyndall that kept the Life Preserver Technical Order up to date on the LPU-9/P for Wright Pat/Brooks.

So it is easy to see that since September 1947 and through the years we have always been working together and continue to this day!

VA ID Cards Are Easily Scanned: Anyone with a smartphone and a bar code app can scan any Department of Veterans Affairs identification card issued since 2004 and the cardholder's Social Security number immediately pops up on the screen. The Department of Veterans Affairs published warnings about the veterans information cards (VICs) on their website in 2011 and again in July, 2013. The alert states, "Some barcode readers, including those available as applications on cell phones, can scan the bar code on the front of the card, and reveal the veteran's social security number." VA has begun to work on a new type of card, which will not contain a Social Security number. Meanwhile, veterans should treat their current ID cards just as careful as they do their Social Security card to prevent identity theft.

Notify DFAS of Life-Changing Events: As you move through your retirement years, make sure you keep DFAS informed whenever anything changes that could affect your retired pay. You should make sure your contact

information and check payment information in myPay are always current. If you experience a life-changing event, make sure you contact DFAS directly at Retired and Annuitant Pay to let them know. Report life-changing events to:

New TRICARE Pharmacy Calculator Debuts: TRICARE.mil features a new tool that lets beneficiaries calculate how much they can save by switching their prescriptions from a retail pharmacy to TRICARE Pharmacy Home Delivery. Beneficiaries can sign up through e-prescribing from their doctor, or by calling, mailing or having their doctor fax their prescription to Express Scripts, the TRICARE pharmacy contractor. Koch who he worked for and with, his involvement in the SAFE Association, his commitment to exceptional H. Koch & Sons aircrew protection products, his friendship, and mentoring of many young Airmen and NCO's. In 1974, in recognition of his contributions to the advancement of hardware for safety and survival applications, Kenny was presented the SAFE Association's Murray P. Koch Award. Kenny's infectious laugh could really light up a room or occasion. He will be missed, but not forgotten.
